Beyond language and culture

Mike Martino talks to us about his passion for Karatsu ware in fluent Japanese. Meeting veteran potter Yoshihisa Tsuruta set him on the path to making Karatsu ceramics. Fascinated with the variety of work produced in the Karatsu tradition, he decided to become a potter. While his work shows his distinct character, he tells us that it is difficult to replicate the Karatsu aesthetic found in the old ware. He tries to make work that changes and expresses its true beauty with repeated use. Simple, beautiful work that represents a blending of cultures.
