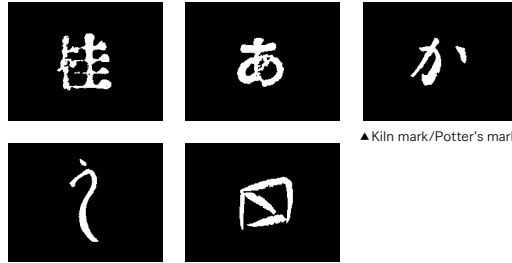


Keikagama
